Stacks of Paper Logs Make Inspections Tough

Webb County Jail was using paper logs before Guard1. With paper logs, inspections were a tough process that involved digging through boxes and boxes of logs, finding the right date, scanning it into the computer, and sending it along for the inspection.

The Outcome

Passing 2 Jail Inspections with Ease

With Guard1, Webb County has been able to nearly eliminate paper logs. Officers make their check and scan the memory button, electronically documenting that the check was made. They use Guard1 and The PIPE for inmate well-being checks, 15-30 minute observation cells, meal check, rec, medical, and monthly inspections for the fire extinguisher.
