### Civil Aviation Safety Authority: fatigue review

The Australian Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) asked the aviation community to comment on recommendations made by a team of leading international specialists after they conducted an independent review of fatigue rules for operators and pilots. The consultation asked respondents to raise any implementation issues and provide feedback on the highest priorities for action to help CASA develop their response to the review.

A wide range of stakeholders took part, including unions and industry representative organisations, air operators and a number of individuals.

Feedback was generally supportive of the review recommendations including the need to modernise Australia's fatigue rules and CASA ultimately decided to adopt 21 of the 24 review recommendations.
