Context & Goals

Cicor operates production sites around the world and has a decentralized corporate structure. The company uses the IntegrityNext platform to achieve the following objectives:

- Consolidate supplier and sustainability data across the group
- Enhance supply chain transparency to ensure regulatory compliance
- Improve communication and collaboration with suppliers
- Integrate supply chain data into the company’s ERP systems

Project Description

Cicor’s Group Compliance team is responsible for implementing regulatory requirements and coordinated the rollout of the IntegrityNext platform in collaboration with Procurement and IT. Local contacts at each production site collect the required data, while analysis is conducted centrally at group level.

The platform was introduced in several phases across the various production sites, with a focus on meeting legal requirements through automated risk analyses, supplier self-assessments, and the distribution of the Supplier Code of Conduct.

Key Outcomes

- **Supply chain transparency:** Over 2,000 tier 1 suppliers assessed, ensuring comprehensive insights into key risks.
- **Added strategic value:** Full supply chain visibility revealed new levers for process optimization and strategic opportunities.
- **Compliance:** Efficient adherence to internal policies and legal requirements (LkSG, DDTro, CSDDD).
- **Supplier Collaboration:** Improved sustainability awareness and supplier communication, supporting faster responses to external crises.
