Designing for success in white

How OKI helped Southwest Customised Clothing tailor its business to meet market demand

THE CHAILENGE

Robert Smith, founder of SWC, had always wanted to set up his own business. He had previous experience working with cut vinyl and designing signs and banners, but when he received a request to design t-shirts, Rob found this difficult to manage with the basic equipment he had access to. So, he decided to set up his own business, developing customised workwear and merchandise and to invest in a production printer to support his new venture.

The first printer he selected was a sublimation device which used heat to bring ink and fabric together. However, Rob came across some limitations as he

was unable to sublimate onto anything other than white or pale colours, this restricted the types of orders the business could handle. As Rob explains, "I was receiving a lot of requests for full-colour print on black t-shirts, polos and hoodies. Unfortunately, I had to turn down the work as I couldn't do it with my existing equipment."

THE SOLUTION

To address this growing demand, Rob spent time investigating how to print on dark garments. "I found that OKI had white toner printers that could handle this and I was impressed with the capability and quality they could offer. I chose OKI's Pro8432WT Digital Transfer Media Printer as it allowed me to use the Forever A to B media, I wanted to use for transfer printing. I knew that with the

OKI printer, I could do a full colour print and lay that onto a black hoodie or a black t-shirt, without any problem."

OKI's Pro8432WT Digital Transfer Media Printer is an A3 device that prints in CMY+White. This offers deep whites on a range of coloured media or provides a neutral white backing layer under colour. As the print is reversed the layer of white is underneath, so the device is effectively capable of printing on media that can then be applied to dark garments.

Furthermore, the white toner can be swapped for black toner for even more flexibility, for designs in black on white or pale garments.

Rob loves the flexibility of the device stating, "The beauty of the Pro8432WT is that it can handle different types

of media. So, you can use special media to print on mugs and easily change this to print onto glass. The versatility of what you can do is fantastic."

Today, Rob mainly uses the OKI printer for producing customised t-shirts, often with logos on the chest and the back as well as coats and hoodies. He estimates that 75% of the work he does consists of clothing, with the remaining quarter split between bags, mugs and other types of merchandise.

THE BENEFITS

One of the main benefits of OKI's Pro8432WT Digital Transfer Media Printer is its media handling capabilities. "You can print on a wide range of different papers and substrates. It's just a matter of choosing the correct setting on the computer. It's very flexible and simple to use" states Rob.

Another key benefit is the significant time saving. For example, Rob can fulfill an order for 20 t-shirts, each requiring a left chest logo, by printing 15-20 of these logos on one sheet using OKI's Pro8432WT Digital Transfer Media Printer. The logos are then pressed onto the t-shirts and the job is completed in just 45 minutes.

"If I was doing the same job using a screen-printing process, the set-up time would be a couple of hours to burn the screens and do all the associated work," he says, "If I was doing it on a direct-to-garment (DTG) machine, it would take six to ten minutes per garment, plus additional time for pre-treatment. So, using the OKI Digital Transfer Media Printer saves a huge amount of time over the course of multiple garments, allowing you to do many more jobs overall than if you were using an alternative approach."

Rob is also very impressed with the print quality of the Pro8432WT. As he explains, "We use the rasterisation software which comes with the device. People need to understand that whenever you print a big solid image

on a garment, no matter what process you use to do it, you are going to need to change the feel of the garment. The rasterisation process that OKI's Digital Transfer Media Printer supports, helps ensure that the image on the garment feels great, washes well and doesn't crack or fade."
