The **Kansas Department of Corrections (KDOC)** is a law enforcement agency in the US state of Kansas. When the agency integrated WizIQ's Virtual Classroom with its existing, Moodle-based Course Management System, they reduced their spending on training by 50% while improving the training experience.

Introduction

The KDOC operates state prisons in Kansas. The institution provides required training for staff, contractors, mentors, and community partners in and around Kansas, in excess of 5,000 people. KDOC's courses are designed for learners ranging from beginners to experts.

The KDOC offers more than 50 online courses, and several hundred live training classes. Many of these classes are asynchronous and self-paced. Others are offered online, or face-to-face in classrooms. Small class sizes, experienced facilitators, and innovative uses of technology all characterize the KDOC's approach to training, whether dealing with facilities, parole offices, or community partners throughout the state.

Challenges

The primary challenges facing the KDOC are reducing costs, improving training, and increasing user satisfaction. They've been using the Moodle Course Management System unofficially since 2006, and officially since 2009. For real-time online interaction, they were using Dimdim, but were not happy with its performance.

Ultimately, they were spending too much on training, the system wasn't very user friendly, and it lacked too many features. Dimdim in particular was tying up a lot of bandwidth. They needed a better synchronous teaching tool.

The Solution

In August 2011, the KDOC integrated the WizIQ Virtual Classroom with their Moodle installation. The institution now uses this new platform for its training and developmental programs designed for staff and other members.
